The Club had also, during the season, its ordinary tournaments, consisting of a Ski-Joring Race divided in three tests, one on each Sunday, won by Wilfrid Chicoine; second, W. Martel; also four Cross Country Races, Roger Roberge winning three of these races, assuring himself the Quebec Championship for the twelve miles race.

The Ski Jumping Competitions were also pretty good, though our hill was more or less well constructed. But all the same we noticed, in the middle of the winter, a young fellow, Roger Godin, fourteen years old, who jumped ninety-five feet and another one, Jean Blanchet, who jumped one hundred and five feet, and this from a tower only 45 feet high.
