THE meeting was opened with the President, Mr. F. A. Hall in the chair, and Mr. Crosby as Secretary-Treasurer. Mr. R. A. Flint was appointed secretary. The notice calling the meeting was read. Credentials from delegates of the following clubs were examined and approved:—

Sotvedt, *Wells*; Mr. Haugen, *Edmonton*; Mr. Ralph Harvey, *Ski Runners Canadian Rockies*; Mr. Art Coles, *Tyee Ski Runners*; Mr. Allan Carscallen, Mr. Art Warriner, *Calgary*; Mr. H. Brown, *Pioneer*; Mr. Ivind Nelsen, *Revelstoke*.

Mr. Nelsen, speaking for Salmo Ski Club, reported that fees were sent in but club does not appear in C.A.S.A. records as a member club. Mr. Kay Hague, in answer to Mr. Nelsen, said that he had sent in dues. Mr. J. Brewster suggested that receipt for money order be produced before any further action was taken.

Moved by Mr. J. Hutchinson, seconded by Mr. J. Brewster, that in view of the cross-country race taking place the following day, the meeting be adjourned until the following evening, Friday, March 5, at 7.30 p.m., when matters of interest to members leaving early would be given precedence. Carried.

Meeting adjourned.

The meeting was opened on Friday evening, March 5, with Mr. F. A. Hall, President, in the chair, Mr. L. S. Crosby as Secretary-Treasurer, and Mrs. Thelma Hutchinson as Secretary.

There were also present the following (in addition to delegates from clubs):—Mr. J. Brewster, *Western Vice-President*; Mr. S. Lockeberg, *Chairman Technical Board*; Mr. Brophy, C.P.R.; Mr. R. A. Flint; Mr. and Mrs. Chris Engh, Mr. Rolf Sivertsen, Mr. A. E. Loberg, and Mr. P. Slattery and Mr. R. Moir of the press.

Credentials from the following clubs were accepted: Camrose, Fuji, Mount Seymour and Winnipeg, in addition to those accepted at the meeting held the previous evening. Mr. Lindsay Loutet stated at the meeting that he had been given authority to represent the Fuji Ski Club. Moved by Mr. Carscallen, seconded by Mr. Haugen, that this representation be accepted. Due to an error, the Hollyburn Pacific Ski Club, with a paid-up membership of approximately 150, had paid only \$10.00 dues. Mr. Loutet, as Zone Chairman made the payment of the balance of the fee, amounting to \$5.00 and the Hollyburn Pacific Ski Club were awarded an extra vote.

In discussion of credentials, it was suggested by Mr. Crosby that in future no club should be permitted to vote unless represented by duly accredited delegates. It was pointed out by several delegates present that they had no notice of any meeting until they arrived at Banff, others stating that notice of the meeting had been received too late for their executives to give them credentials in the proper manner.

Minutes of previous Annual Meeting:—Moved by Mr. H. Richards, seconded by Mr. Carscallen, that these minutes, as printed in the 1936-37 Ski Annual be accepted. Carried.

Minutes of previous Western Annual Meeting:—Moved by Mr. K. Hague, seconded by Mr. R. Harvey, that these minutes, as printed in the "Hiker and Skier," be accepted. Carried.

Mr. Hall reported briefly on the year's work and expressed his satisfaction with the results obtained. There were 75 member clubs in the Association last year. This year the number has risen to 100 an increase of 25 per cent. The formation of new clubs has been encouraged. At the last annual meeting the financial statement showed a balance on hand of \$7.55. This year a much more favourable report is expected. With the inclusion of Slalom and Downhill, and the combination of these events, also Ladies' events, in the Dominion Championships, it has been necessary to award nine gold medals in place of the former three. Mr. Hall stated that it has been decided to use gold-plated medals, at a large saving over the cost of the former solid gold medals. Due to this and other similar means of cutting expenses, he hoped that in the near future it might be possible to return to the various Zones a portion of their dues. A complete detailed report from the president will be sent in for publication in the "Hiker and Skier" for the information of all Western Clubs.

Report of the Vice-President (Western):—Mr. J. Brewster, Western Vice-President, gave a very brief report, stating that he was pleased with the representation at the meeting and that he believed the western clubs were working together more harmoniously than had previously been the case.

Report of Executives (J. Southam, K. Hague):—Mr. Southam presents his report as follows:

During the course of the season only two major difficulties have been drawn to my attention. One was the ratification of the appointment of a Chairman of the Technical Ski Board. In the absence of Mr. Brewster, and at the request of Mr. Lockeberg, I was asked to get the consensus of opinion in the West.

It has also been brought to my attention that the dates for the Western Championships, Jumping and Cross-Country, conflicted with those of the Alberta Provincial Four-Event Championships. The Kimberley Ski Club had requested, and been granted this Championship at the Spring Meeting in Vancouver, but at the time no dates were set. The "Canadian Ski Year Book" published this as the Western Championship, February 13 and 14, but previous to this we had received no official notification, and had already published the dates of the Banff Winter Carnival. On the whole this was a very unfortunate occurrence, but actually these conflicting dates did not interfere with the tournament to any extent as the proximity of the dates of the Dominion Tournament to those of the Provincial Tournament meant that there would not in any event have been many entries in the Provincial. However, it is possible that the Kimberley Ski Club might have had one or two entries from Banff which they didn't have, but next year I believe all dates should be officially published previous to September 30.

Mr. Hague's report expressed the opinion that perhaps some of the Western Clubs had felt slightly neglected in the past but pointed out that with the great improvement in the method of administration, this situation would remedy itself. He commented favourably on the growing friendship and cordiality between the Associations in Canada and the United States, and the advisability of maintaining this attitude to the best of our ability. The Zone situation is being cleared up and next season things will be run on a more satisfactory basis.

Report of the Chairman of the Technical Ski Board:—

Mr. Lockeberg opened his report with praise for Mr. Hall's work in the Association. He expressed regret at the poor ski-ing conditions which had prevailed this season in Eastern Canada, which had made it difficult to keep up the public's interest in the sport. The work of the Technical Board consists of the standardization of rules, enforcement of said rules, and all arrangements governing competitions and tournaments. The Board has worked out a new Jumping Table based on the English measurement and using feet instead of metres, and had asked Mr. Arnold Lunn to represent the Association at the F.I.S. Congress at Chamonix, at which meeting he was to present this table to the F.I.S. with the request that it be considered for English-

speaking countries. It was proposed also to the F.I.S. that they reduce the fees for member clubs from the present \$65.00 to between \$20.00 and \$30.00. The present fees are considered exorbitant, as owing to geographical difficulties, we receive very little benefit from the F.I.S. in proportion to our fees.

Mr. Lockeberg also pointed out to the meeting that at present each club or Zone arrange for the printing of its own score cards, and that it would be a great advantage if the Association looked after this matter, with the result that score cards all over Canada would be alike. Also, all technical difficulties should be taken up with the nearest member of the Technical Ski Board, in writing, and a copy of the letter sent to the Zone Chairman and to the Western Vice-Chairman of the Board. This would obviate the necessity of exchanging correspondence between the West and East which naturally entails delay and puts too much work on the Chairman of the Board and his assistants. He urged that all clubs increase the number of competitions for juniors, and keep up the supply of future competitors. A printed hand-book for judges and officials is being considered and suggestions from all clubs would be welcome. More judges are required for competitions. Each club should have a number of qualified men. Classes for judging have been held in Eastern Canada, with great success, and it was suggested that the members of the Technical Ski Board or the Zone Chairmen take up the work of organizing such classes in the west. Mr. Lockeberg concluded his report by asking that all clubs endeavour to co-operate fully with Mr. Hall and in particular to refrain from referring to him unnecessary details which could be settled by the western executive or their Zone Chairmen.

Recommendations to the F.I.S.:—

Mr. Hall reported that Mr. Arnold Lunn had consented to represent the Association at the F.I.S. Congress this spring and had been asked to bring up the following points:—

1. Are we entitled to copies of the minutes of the F.I.S. meetings? So far we have not received any.
2. Can we secure copies of these minutes in English? They are usually written in French or German.
3. Can we secure copies of the Rules and Regulations in English and French?
4. In the event that an F.I.S. Tournament be substituted for future Olympic Ski-ing Tournaments, would Canada be eligible to hold this event at some future date?
5. Under present conditions, is Canada entitled to bid for the F.I.S. races?
6. Can we borrow or buy from the F.I.S. good instructional moving picture films?
7. Can we secure copies of the original designs for standard jumping hills for 20, 40 and 60 metres? (Copies of these designs have since been received).
8. Have the F.I.S. devised a combined-point system for four events?
9. To what advantage is the C.A.S.A. entitled, as member of the F.I.S.? (The F.I.S. Congress was held sometime during the month of February and answers to these questions are expected shortly.)

Reports of the Zone Chairmen:—

Report of the Rocky Mountain Ski Zone was as follows: At first this Zone consisted of Alberta and the C.P.R. line as far west as Revelstoke, but was subsequently split at Red Deer and the Northern Alberta Ski Zone was formed. In this Zone, the Camrose Ski Club and the Edmonton Ski Club have taken out membership. The Revelstoke Ski Club, who had dropped out of the C.A.S.A., rejoined and one new club was formed at Lake Louise. Canmore Ski Club will be joining the C.A.S.A. next season. The Technical Ski Board for the Zone has had Zone Competitors' Cards printed and all Zone competitors rated according to their past performances.

The Report of the Vancouver Ski Zone was submitted by Mr. L. Loutet. There are at present 11

clubs in this Zone, Vancouver, Hollyburn Pacific, Tyee Ski Runners, Fuji, Grouse Mountain, Vancouver Winter Sports Club, Columbia Junior, Amber, Princeton, Mount Seymour, and Pioneer, nine of which are fully paid up. The Pioneer Ski Club and Columbia Ski Club were reported as being in arrears, but are expected to regain their good standing shortly. Mr. Loutet urged that all fees be collected by the Zones and forwarded direct to the Treasurer of the Association. He explained that the Vancouver Zone was financed by levying a charge of 10 cents per head on each club, based on their paid-up membership. An additional source of revenue had been found through the issuance of Competitors' Cards, and it was hoped that in the future some of the money from these cards could be used to send Vancouver Zone skiers to other Zone competitions. He reported a good year.

Report of the Northern B.C. Zone was given by Mr. H. Sotvedt, who stated that only three or four clubs have membership. This year the Zone executive is in Wells and meetings can be held only in the fall, with the possibility of an additional meeting at the Zone championships. This makes good organization difficult. One new club has been formed at Francois Lake.

Report of the Secretary Treasurer, Mr. L. S. Crosby:—

The financial statement to date shows a bank balance of \$118.50. After all expenses are paid, it is hoped that the end of the season will leave between \$50.00 and \$60.00 in the treasury, which is a great improvement over the previous year. Mr. Crosby recommended that a Finance Committee be set up in Western Canada. The whole financial set-up should be revised and all clubs notified exactly when and to whom they should pay their fees. At the present time, due to lack of information or misunderstanding, the clubs are remitting to several various points, with resulting confusion. There are twenty-seven clubs in the west, with the possibility of an additional three. A complete financial report will be submitted to the secretary-treasurer of the C.A.S.A. at the end of the season. Though not as a part of his report, Mr. Crosby suggested that inter-scholastic meets be held regularly for the improvement of ski-ing amongst the juniors.

Report of Mr. Gillians, Secretary-Treasurer of the C.A.S.A.:—

Moved by Mr. N. Beaumont, seconded by Mr. J. Nordmoe, that this report be accepted. Carried.

Election of Officers:—

A national executive consisting of eleven or twelve members having been found rather unwieldy, Mr. Hall suggested that this number be reduced to about seven. Under existing conditions the Western clubs have the privilege of electing three executives on the C.A.S.A. in addition to their vote for president. If it were finally decided to reduce the number of members on the C.A.S.A. executive, it might be advisable to have only two men elected from the west. Moved by Mr. Hague, seconded by Mr. Richards, that the meeting elect a Western Vice-President together with two other executive officers, and if it were found later that our representation should consist of only one other executive member, besides the Western Vice-President, then the man with the majority of votes would be retained and the other eliminated. Carried. Mr. Crosby, Mr. Flint, Mr. Engh were appointed as scrutineers.

Election of National President:—

Nominated: Mr. F. A. Hall. Proposed by Mr. J. Brewster, seconded by Mr. P. Fowler.

Moved by Mr. Laurillard, seconded by Mr. Sotvedt, that nominations be closed. The western votes (45) towards Mr. Hall's re-election were unanimous.

Election of Western Vice-President:—

Nominated: Mr. J. Southam. Proposed by Mr. Hague, seconded by Mr. Laurillard.

Nominated: Mr. J. Hutchinson. Proposed by Mr. N. Nelsen, seconded by Mr. Fowler.

Moved by Mr. Hague, seconded by Mr. Brewster that nominations be closed.

The result of the ballot was in favour of Mr. J. Southam, Calgary, who will take on the Western Vice-Presidency for the coming year.

Election of Two Members of the Executive:—

Nominated: Mr. K. Engstad. Proposed by Mr. H. Sotvedt, seconded by Mr. L. Loutet.

Nominated: Mr. K. Hague. Proposed by Mr. E. Laurillard, seconded by Mr. H. Davidson.

Nominated: Mr. J. Hutchinson. Proposed by Mr. P. Fowler, seconded by Mr. H. Brown.

Moved by Mr. Laurillard, seconded by Mr. Fowler, that nominations be closed.

As the result of the voting, Mr. Engstad and Mr. Hague were elected, it being understood that if our representation were limited to one man, Mr. Engstad would take the position.

Election of Vice-Chairman of the Technical Board:—

Nominated: Mr. Nels Nelsen. Proposed by Mr. G. Garrish, seconded by Mr. N. Beaumont.

Nominated: Mr. C. Stokand. Proposed by Mr. K. Hague, seconded by Mr. Loutet.

Nominated: Mr. Chris Engh. Proposed by Mr. J. Hutchinson, seconded by Mr. E. Laurillard.

Moved by Mr. Laurillard, seconded by Mr. Carscallen, that nominations be closed.

Mr. Loberg was appointed scrutineer in place of Mr. Engh.

Result of the ballot favoured Mr. C. Stockand of Banff.

Appointment of Committees:—

Moved by Mr. G. Garrish, seconded by Mr. E. Laurillard, that all committees be appointed later by the incoming Western executive. Carried.

Unfinished Business:—

Mr. P. Fowler, of the Kimberley Ski Club, pointed out to the meeting that more attention should be paid to the setting of dates for Provincial, Zone and other tournaments. One definite confliction of dates had occurred in that the Western Canada Championships, sponsored by the Kimberley Ski Club, were held on the same date as the Alberta Provincial Championships. Also that the Western Canada Championships had been set a week ahead of the B.C. Championships.

Other points in his address were: (1) That the C.A.S.A. should show definitely some of the smaller clubs what advantages they gained by joining the Association. (2) That the Association might be able to arrange reduced fares, such as in the present instance the special rates to Banff, instead of leaving these matters to the individual clubs. (3) That more competitions be held for junior members of all clubs.

Mr. Lockeberg pointed out to the meeting that the matter of getting general reduced railway fares was being looked after by the Association as much as possible, and that better reductions were only to be obtained by giving the public more and better tournaments. In stressing the advisability of all clubs belonging to the C.A.S.A., he followed the line that "in unity there is strength."

In connection with special railway fares, Mr. Loutet stated that these special rates from Vancouver had been obtained only after a great difficulty and were good only from Vancouver, also that a guarantee had to be put up in advance, whereas no guarantee was required from any other point. The success of any tournament depends on the attendance of skiers from every ski-ing point, not only from the main centres, and it was suggested by Mr. Hall that it would be to the advantage of the railway companies to make sure that any special rates put into effect for competitions are general from all points from which competitors are expected.

It was conceded by the meeting that the causes for the complaints noted were merely oversights on the part of the railway company and a vote of confidence in their co-operation was passed. Moved by Mr. Laurillard, seconded by Mr. Fowler, that a Transportation Committee be appointed by the Western Executive. Carried.

Moved by Mr. Fowler, seconded by Mr. Laurillard, that all applications for tournament dates should be placed in the hands of the Western Executive before July 1 in any year, and that all clubs should be notified of these dates before November 1 of the same year. Carried.

Mr. Hall pointed out the inadvisability of either the East or the West holding a Dominion Championship together with either an Eastern or a Western Canada Championship.

Mr. J. Nordmoe asked Mr. Hall why the names of the winners of the Racing, Jumping, and Combined Events in the Dominion Championships at Revelstoke in 1931, were not engraved on the trophies which had been awarded. Mr. R. Lymbourne was the winner of the Jumping and Mr. H. Snedja the winner of the Racing and Combined. Mr. Hall stated that he thought this had been done, but in any case it would be looked after as soon as possible.

A few clubs throughout Canada are not quite sure which Zone they belong to. These clubs should forward their reports and recommendations to the C.A.S.A.

It was announced that the Dominion Championship Jumping Event, scheduled for 10 o'clock on Sunday, March 7, would be held instead at 11 o'clock of the same day.

Mr. Fowler proposed that a special Membership Committee be inaugurated in the C.A.S.A., whose chief objective would be to enlarge upon the benefits of organized ski-ing, to tabulate the facilities of the existing clubs in the Association and circulate them amongst all other clubs which might make use of them, to compile a list of useful suggestions for all clubs, etc., to inaugurate a special class of membership in the C.A.S.A. for skiers who have no opportunity of joining a ski club.
