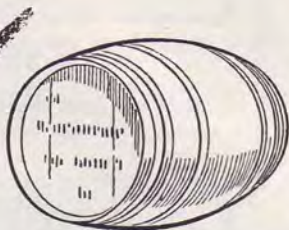

### Tyee Ski Runners

IN THE second year of our existence the growth of the Tyee Ski Runners and the scope of our activities enlarged to such a degree that even our most optimistic members were agreeably surprised. Our membership has almost trebled from last year, included in which are a number of very promising juniors.

A rather unique feature was introduced in the Club, that of an election of a mayor and town council to govern the affairs of our ski village. Regular campaigns were made by the candidates for the posts of mayor, town constable, sanitary engineer, etc., which culminated in one grand jamboree of speeches and impossible promises by the various candidates. The mayors elect came dressed in their conceptions of what a well dressed mayor should wear, which costumes included top hats, dinner jackets and villainous moustache. The successful candidate for the mayor's office, Roy Clendenning, possibly owed his success to the large supply of black cigars he freely passed around.

In conjunction with other clubs on Grouse Mountain a new downhill course was constructed on Dam Mountain and existing ski runs were considerably improved.

Much added incentive in Club Championships' Competitions was provided by Joe Wepsala and Arvi Matilla, who donated handsome trophies for the A and B Class Men's Club Championships. The new trophies donated by the Club for Combined Downhill and Slalom, A and B Men, and A Women, resulted in some very close competitions. Mickey Mitchell made practically a complete sweep in all A Class competitions, winning both the Club Championship and the Combined Downhill and Slalom trophies. In the men's B Class division competition was very keen, Gibb Nichols having a lead of only 6/10 of a point over Bud Stevens for the Combined Downhill and Slalom trophy. Bud Stevens, however, piled up a larger margin to win the Four-way Combined trophy. In the women's division, Mrs. Margaret Lewis, by placing first in all events, annexed both the club shield emblematic of the Club Championship, and the Combined Downhill and Slalom trophy. The shield for the Junior Boys section was won quite handily by Harry Smithers.

The Grouse Mountain Novice Championships, sponsored by the Tyees had a record breaking entry list of over sixty competitors. Our entrants were fortunate in placing first in both Downhill and Slalom and second and third in the Cross-Country racing. In the women's division a second and third was obtained in each event.

The Vancouver City Championships were, for the first time, run off in two sections; the Cross-Country and Jumping being allotted to Hollyburn Ridge and the Downhill and Slalom section to Grouse Mountain. The Grouse Mountain Ski Club and the Tyees joined forces to handle this important event. We are particularly proud of our Miss Gertrude Wepsala who placed first in this important competition, closely followed by Miss Vi Burton.

During the season numerous mountain dances were held, also one large dance and floor show at the Centre Gymnasium, all very well attended. Weekly luncheons were also inaugurated, these being very handy for club members to get together to formulate plans for the ensuing weekends. Our club organ, the "Pow Wow," enjoyed increased popularity, and is now being mailed direct to each member.

The current season wound up with a dinner and general meeting on May 14 at the Hotel Georgia. Presentations of trophies were made, committee reports were approved and the following executives elected for the 1937-38 season:—*President*, G. K. Claridge; *Vice-President*, M. Mitchell; *Treasurer*, Miss A. Haksi; *Secretary*, Miss E. Gould.
